Whereas, Anchor House has served abused, runaway, homeless, and at-risk youth of Mercer County for 40 years, and has successfully reduced harm to our children, providing an invaluable service that makes our community a better place to live; and

Whereas, Anchor House celebrates its 40th Anniversary on Saturday, October 20, 2018 and honors the achievements of outstanding organizations and individuals in the Mercer County community; and

Whereas, this year's recipient of the Anchor House Visionary Award is Joseph Yuhas, whose vision helped create Anchor House 40 years ago and who served as President of the agency's first Board of Directors; and

Whereas, Joseph Yuhas worked tirelessly with other community leaders to demonstrate the need for an adolescent crisis shelter in Trenton, and was able to obtain both approval for the shelter and funding through volunteerism, including the signature Ride for Runaways event that was his brainchild; and
