Boardworkers are needed throughout Mercer County, Sign-up today!

Am I eligible to serve?

YES! If you are registered to vote in Mercer County.

YES! If you are able to read and write legibly.

YES! If you can lift at least 25 lbs. (the weight of a voting machine) without difficulty.

What do I have to do?

- ◆ Report to your assigned polling place by 5:15 AM on Election Day.
- Prepare the polling area for the voters
- ♦ Set up voting equipment and supplies
- ♦ Open the polls and process the voters
- Enjoy your one hour meal break during the day
- Close the Polls and complete final paperwork.
- Pick up and/or return election supplies to the Municipal Clerk. (1 or 2 people needed.)

What training do I need?

By law, Boardworkers must attend a training class every two years or when there is a significant change in election procedures.

Classes are held two times a year and last about two hours.

Boardworkers are instructed on their duties regarding

voting machines, voter eligibility, provisional ballots and registration books.

When will I be needed?

Boardworkers are needed for the...

Special School Board Elections
Special Municipal Elections
June Primary Election
November General Election



What is the Compensation?

Full Day Shift is 5:15 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.- \$200 Half Day Shift (a.m. or p.m. only)-\$100

A.M. shift is 5:15 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. **P.M. shift** is 1:00 p.m. 8:00 p.m.

Where will I work?

In a District that may need additional help or where a vacancy exists. Each District should have at least four Boardworkers; two Democrats and two Republicans. Consideration is given to place Boardworkers in or close to where they live. New Boardworkers are placed with experienced ones.



Now Hiring High-School Students!

ARE YOU A STUDENT AGE 16 AND OLDER?

Mercer County participates in a state-wide program that hires high school students ages 16 to 18 to be poll workers for the Primary and General Elections.

Currently school districts in Hamilton, Hopewell Valley, Princeton, Trenton and West Windsor are participating in the program.

Students must be Mercer County residents and need permission from their parents and their school to participate.

After attending the training, the students will be assigned to assist a specific polling location.

Students 16 or 17 years old can work a half-day shift, either 5:15 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. or 1:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Students 18 years old are eligible to work an entire day. The pay is \$100 a half a day, or \$200 for full day.
